American Humanics is a national organization that collaborates with affiliated college/university programs and nonprofit agencies in recruiting, preparing, and placing students in meaningful careers with youth and human service agencies. Participation in the American Humanics program builds on and enhances its students' chosen major courses of study and provides them with the tools to achieve success in the field of nonprofit management.



The American Humanics Minor at UCF will provide interdisciplinary classroom experience and experiential learning opportunities for students planning a career as a nonprofit professional. Students who complete the program requirements will receive a minor and a Humanics Academic Program.

WHY AMERICAN HUMANICS?

Nonprofit Youth and Human Service agencies play a vital role in the care and development of our society. To fulfill their mission, these organizations need dedicated, trained professionals with the desire and ability to make a difference in their community and in the lives of others.



Each year, nonprofit agencies need 50,000 entry-level professionals to fill staff vacancies. Unfortunately, an adequate pool of diverse, competent candidates does not exist. American Humanics answers this need by enabling college students to learn and apply leadership skill. The American Humanics curriculum makes it possible for students to make a difference by educating and training them in various skills needed in the nonprofit sector.

PROGRAM

AMERICAN HUMANICS AT UCF

The American Humanics Minor program at UCF consists of 19 credit hours at the undergraduate level. The course requirements are broken down as follows:

- ◆ American Humanics Human Service Workshop
- ◆ American Humanics Internship
- ◆ Twelve Credit Hours in courses with the following emphases:
 - General Nonprofit Management, Volunteerism, and Human Development
 - Planning & Evaluations and Human Resource Development
 - Communication and Marketing
 - Nonprofit Accounting & Financial Management and Fundraising Principles and Practices

Other Requirements:

- ◆ Enrollment in American Humanics Certificate Program
- ◆ Attendance at one national American Humanics Management Institute (additional fees)
- ◆ Membership in UCF American Humanics Student Association (AHSA).
